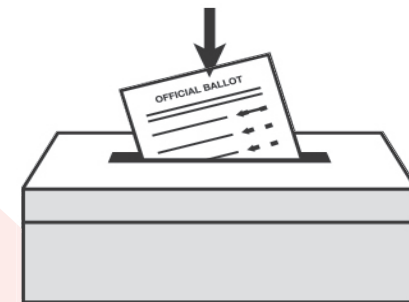

Welcome to your Fresno County Voter Information Guide for the Statewide Consolidated Primary Election to be held **June 5, 2018**. Your vote is the most important part of the electoral process. Please take a few moments to read this guide and prepare for your voting experience.

Remember, you do not have to wait for Election Day to cast your ballot. Early voting will begin at the County Clerk's office beginning Monday, May 7, 2018. All vote-by-mail ballots received in the County Clerk's office before Election Day **are the first ballots counted** on Election Night.

You can also participate in the election in a different manner – as a Precinct Officer. We need precinct officers for this and future elections. Please consider this exciting opportunity. Voters who are also bilingual are needed. Please call 559-600-1620 or visit FresnoVote.com and sign-up today!

A new language access page has been included in your Voter Information Guide. Some of our precincts now provide ballots translated into one of eight languages! To see what ballot languages your polling place will have on hand, please visit FresnoVote.com and click on "Check your Voter Status."

Recently, some laws pertaining to elections have changed. Those that will be in effect at this election, are as follows:

- A voter may now designate anyone to return their vote-by-mail ballot. Previously only the voter's family or household member could return a vote-by-mail ballot for a voter.
- A vote-by-mail voter may request a translated facsimile ballot be sent to them, if they live in a covered language precinct (check FresnoVote.com).
- If a person misses the 15-day voter registration deadline, they can still register and vote by visiting our downtown office up to and through Election Day and vote "conditionally".

The County Clerk/Registrar of Voter's office has a friendly staff to help you and ensure the integrity of the process. The goal of our office is to ensure a smooth and convenient voting experience for you, the voter. Please contact us with any questions or concerns and thank you for participating in this election.

## IMPORTANT VOTER NOTICE

### CANDIDATES ACCEPTING VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN SPENDING LIMITS

Proposition 34, was adopted by the voters at the November 7, 2000 General Election. Provisions of this law limit the amount of contributions by individuals and other entities and require all candidates running for statewide office, State Assembly and Senate to declare whether they will voluntarily limit their campaign expenditures.

Candidates, who voluntarily limit their campaign expenditures in accordance with Proposition 34, may submit a candidate statement for inclusion in the sample ballot booklet. Following is a list of legislative candidates who have agreed to voluntary spending limits:

## **Elections in California**

The Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act requires that all candidates for a voter-nominated office be listed on the same ballot. Previously known as partisan offices, voter-nominated offices are state legislative offices, U.S. congressional offices, and state constitutional offices.

In both the open primary and general elections, you can vote for any candidate regardless of what party preference you indicated on your voter registration form. In the primary election, the two candidates receiving the most votes—regardless of party preference—move on to the general election. If a candidate receives a majority of the vote (50 percent +1), a general election still must be held.

California's open primary system does not apply to candidates running for U.S. President, county central committee, or local offices.

Write-in candidates for voter-nominated offices can still run in the primary election. However, a write-in candidate can only move on to the general election if the candidate is one of the top two vote-getters in the primary election. Additionally, there is no independent nomination process for a general election.

Superintendent of Public Instruction is a nonpartisan office. If a candidate for Superintendent of Public Instruction were to receive a majority of the vote (at least 50 percent +1) at the primary election, then that candidate would be elected, and no general election would be held. Additional information on nonpartisan offices can be found below.

California law requires the following information to be printed in this guide.

### **Voter-Nominated Offices**

Political parties are not entitled to formally nominate candidates for voter-nominated offices at the primary election. A candidate nominated for a voter-nominated office at the primary election is the nominee of the people and not the official nominee of any party at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a voter-nominated office shall have his or her qualified party preference, or lack of qualified party preference, stated on the ballot, but the party preference designation is selected solely by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not mean the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party designated, or that there is an affiliation between the party and candidate, and no candidate nominated by the voters shall be deemed to be the officially nominated candidate of any political party. In the county voter information guide, parties may list the candidates for voter-nominated offices who have received the party's official endorsement.

Any voter may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated office, if they meet the other qualifications required to vote for that office. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the voter-nominated office even if both candidates have specified the same party preference designation. No party is entitled to have a candidate with its party preference designation move on to the general election, unless the candidate is one of the two highest vote-getters at the primary election.

### **Nonpartisan Offices**

Political parties are not entitled to nominate candidates for nonpartisan offices at the primary election, and a candidate at the primary election is not the official nominee of any party for the specific office at the general election. A candidate for nomination to a nonpartisan office may not designate his or her party preference, or lack of party preference, on the ballot. The top two vote-getters at the primary election move on to the general election for the nonpartisan office.

# Fresno County Multilingual Voter Services Program

Fresno County official ballots and election materials are printed in the English and Spanish languages and available at all polling locations.

In addition, voter assistance and facsimile ballots in Punjabi, Hmong, Chinese, Vietnamese, Korean, Khmer, and Tagalog languages are available at designated precinct polling locations in Fresno County. Voters who require assistance may bring up to two people to assist them in marking their ballot at the polling location. A Vote-by-Mail voter who lives in a designated precinct may call, mail, fax or email a request to receive a copy of a facsimile ballot in Punjabi, Hmong, Chinese, Vietnamese, Korean, Khmer, and Tagalog by mail. The request must be received by the elections official no later than 7 days before an election. La boletas y los materiales electorales del condado de Fresno están impresos en inglés y en español y disponibles en todas las sedes de votación.

Además, hay asistencia y boletas facsímiles disponibles en panyabí, hmong, chino, vietnamita, coreano, jemer y tagalo están disponibles en la sede de votación y recintos electorales designados en el condado de Fresno. Los electores que necesiten ayuda pueden traer hasta dos personas para que les ayuden a marcar su boleta en la sede de votación. Un elector de voto por correo que viva en un recinto electoral designado puede llamar, enviar por correo postal, por fax o por correo electrónico una solicitud para recibir una copia de una boleta facsímil en panyabí, hmong, chino, vietnamita, coreano, jemer y tagalo por correo. La solicitud debe recibirse antes de las elecciones oficiales antes de 7 días antes de una elección. SECTION 16. The appointive County officers shall be:

Members of the Civil Service Commission  
Members of the Planning Commission  
Agricultural Commissioner  
Probation Officer  
County Health Officer  
Director of Weights and Measures  
Director of Public Works  
County Administrative Officer  
County Counsel

Such other officers as now are or which may be hereafter authorized by the general law of the State of California or this Charter and established in pursuance thereof.

The Board of Supervisors shall appoint, suspend or remove, subject to the provisions of this Charter the following officers, boards and commissions: County Administrative Officer, County Counsel, members of the Civil Service Commission, members of the Planning Commission, Boards and Commissions not otherwise provided for by this Charter.

The County Administrative Officer shall appoint, suspend or remove, with prior approval of the Board of Supervisors, and subject to Civil Service procedures where applicable, all other appointive County officers, except as provided in this Charter. All appointive officers shall have the qualifications and exercise the powers and privileges and perform the duties and functions which now are or which may be hereafter prescribed for their respective offices by the Constitution and laws of the State of California, this Charter, and the ordinances and resolutions of the Board of Supervisors. The Director of Public Works shall be a registered civil engineer of the State of California and shall be ex-officio ~~County Surveyor and~~ Road Commissioner, and as such shall have the powers and privileges and perform the functions and duties which now are or which may be hereafter prescribed for such office by the Constitution and laws of the State of California, this Charter, and the ordinances and resolutions of the Board of Supervisors. **The Director of Public Works shall appoint a County Surveyor qualified under the laws of the State of California, who**

**shall be subordinate to and directly responsible to the Director and who shall have the powers and privileges and perform the function and duties which now are or may be hereafter prescribed for such office by the Constitution and laws of the State of California, this Charter and the ordinances and resolutions of the Board of Supervisors. If the Director of Public Works is qualified under the laws of the State of California to serve as County Surveyor, the Director may be appointed as County Surveyor pursuant to this section.**

**IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS BY COUNTY COUNSEL**

Fresno County Charter Section 16 presently requires the County Director of Public Works to be a registered civil engineer and provides that the Director of Public Works shall be the "ex-officio County surveyor". In order to hold the title of County surveyor, a person must be licensed by the State or specifically exempted from licensure. Voter approval of this measure will amend Charter Section 16 to remove the requirement that the County Director of Public Works shall be "ex-officio County surveyor" and add the provision that the County Director of Public Works shall appoint a separate qualified County surveyor if the Director of Public Works is not certified to practice as a licensed surveyor in the State of California.

This measure was placed on the ballot by order of the Fresno County Board of Supervisors.

## ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE A

The proposed amendment to Section 16 of the Fresno County Charter would update the requirements for the Director of Public Works to match current educational and professional requirements.

Voters originally approved Fresno County's Charter in 1933; the requirement that the Director of Public Works be qualified both as a civil engineer and a surveyor has been included in Section 16 of the Charter since 1954. Since that time, the educational and professional requirements for licensure in the two occupations have changed. In the past, the education and licensure as a civil engineer qualified a person to perform the functions of a professional surveyor. Since the 1980's, the surveyor field has developed into a specialized field of study with separate licensure requirements. Under state law, civil engineers licensed prior to 1982 may perform the functions of a professional surveyor, but it is becoming increasingly rare for individuals to have been certified civil engineers for that long or to have obtained licensure in both professional occupations. This severely restricts the pool of qualified applicants for the position of the County Director of Public Works.

Removing the requirement that the Director of Public Works be a licensed surveyor will have no negative impact on the ability of that person to perform the duties of the Director. The County already employs a class of deputy surveyors who perform the day-to-day surveying tasks required of the department. In addition, the proposed amendment allows the Director to be the County Surveyor if that person does possess both civil engineering and surveying licensures.

We urge a yes vote on Measure A allowing the Director of Public Works to appoint a County Surveyor, if the Director is not a licensed surveyor.

Contact our office to ask for a replacement ballot.

## How do I turn in my vote-by-mail ballot?

You must return your ballot in the envelope provided. You can:

- Mail your ballot (U.S. Post Office recommends one week before election day),
- Drop it off inside the Registrar of Voters' Office at 2221 Kern Street, Fresno, CA, Monday – Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. (regular hours), or in the secured metal drop box outside our office (available 24/7), or
- Drop it off at any polling place in Fresno County on Election Day between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m., or
- Drop it off at one of our drive-thru locations on Election Day between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m.

***Deadline: Your ballot must be at the Registrar of Voters' Office or at the polls by 8 p.m. election night, or postmarked June 5, 2018 and received by election officials within 3 days.***

## What if I forgot to sign my return envelope?

Your ballot cannot be counted without a valid signature. If we receive your unsigned ballot envelope by Election Day, we will try to contact you for your signature. You will have until 5:00 p.m. on the eighth day after the election to sign your ballot envelope.



## Can I check to see if you have received my vote-by-mail ballot?

Yes. We have an automated system, available on our website 24/7 that can check if your ballot was received. Go to: [www.FresnoVote.com](http://www.FresnoVote.com) and click "Check Your Voter Status," or call (559) 600-VOTE (8683) for assistance.



If the Elections Office receives your vote-by-mail ballot before Election Day, it will be counted by 8 p.m. on Election Day. If you drop your vote-by-mail ballot off at the polls, it will be counted within three to four days after Election Day.

# Information for Voters Voting at the Polls

## **What happens when I go to the polls on Election Day?**

- First, a precinct officer will ask you to state or provide your name and address.
- Second, you will be asked to sign the Roster of Voters.
- Third, the precinct officer will give you a ballot and secrecy sleeve and direct you to a voting booth.
- Finally, you mark your ballot and deposit it in the ballot box.

If you need assistance with the voting process, ask the precinct officer to help you.

## **Do I need identification to vote?**

The only voters who will be asked for ID at the polls are those who registered by mail but didn't provide a drivers' license number on the registration form and are voting for the first time for a federal office.

## **What if my name isn't on the Roster of Voters or I don't have my Vote-By-Mail ballot to surrender?**

If your name is not on the Roster of Voters at the polling place, or you are a Vote-by-Mail voter, but do not have your ballot to surrender, a precinct officer will offer you a "provisional ballot".

## **What is a "provisional ballot"?**

A "provisional ballot" is an official ballot that the voter gets at the polls and puts inside a special pink envelope after they have signed the provisional roster. The voter fills out and signs the form on the envelope, and returns it to a precinct officer. The ballot inside the envelope is counted after Election Day provided the voter is registered to vote in Fresno County and has not voted elsewhere in that election. Provisional voters get a receipt with a phone number they can call no sooner than 40 days after the election to check if their ballot was counted.

## **Why would my name not be printed on the Roster of Voters at the polls?**

The most common reasons are:

- You are in the wrong polling place, or
- You changed your name and did not re-register to vote, or
- You moved into Fresno County or moved to a new precinct within Fresno County but did not re-register to vote, or
- You never registered or you registered after the deadline.

**NOTE: Election mail cannot be forwarded. Be sure to re-register to vote if you move or change your name, otherwise you will not receive election mail and your name may not be on the Roster at your polling place.**

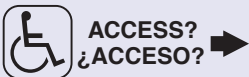
