## **PRESONS SERVED**

It is essential that service providers include accurate information on the number of persons receiving services. To the extent possible, the reporting information should include unduplicated counts of persons served. It is recognized that some duplication will occur, especially for services such as outreach during which clear client identification may not be achieved. Duplication may also occur when individuals receive services from more than one provider or when individuals relocate from one

geographic area to another.
