Re: Support for Multipronged Approach to SUD and Overdose Response in Fresno County

Dear Dawan:

As a follow up to our conversation on Tuesday, June 8, 2021 about some of the ongoing need in Fresno County related to substance use, and in particular increases in overdoses and methamphetamine use, below please find a proposal for Health Management Associates (HMA) to provide consulting services focused on building out an effective community response to overdose events and addiction in your community.

HMA proposes to support the Fresno County Department of Behavioral Health (FDBH) implement a multipronged approach to this issue. HMA will work with FDBH to convene a cross sector community response team (CRT) that can focus on a coordinated, intentional response to overdoses in the county as well as preparing a plan of action for harm reduction and prevention as part of Fresno County's overall response to the crisis of addiction.

Utilizing the Collective Impact Framework as a guide, HMA will support the development of common goals, mutually reinforcing activities, a communication plan, and shared measurement across partners in the county who will make up the CRT. HMA will also work with these partners to develop a sustainability plan for the CRT's evolution and ongoing work when HMA's support is no longer needed. HMA will provide subject matter expertise to the development and use of communications materials and to activities of the CRT to ensure alignment with evidence-based or promising practices, utilizing experts in our Institute on Addiction.

HMA will prepare and provide a series of tabletop exercises simulating likely scenarios of overdose events in Fresno County to prepare the CRT members and the staff of their agencies who are likely to be engaged in response and follow up to overdose events in the county. These tabletop exercises will help bring partners together in Fresno County to discuss naloxone access, additional training needs, treatment shortages, communication gaps, and any other community needs regarding effective response.

HMA has been working with communities across the United States to address the addiction crisis, including preparing CRTs to implement activities ranging from emergency response to mass overdose events, community education campaigns, naloxone distribution and training for how to administer naloxone, medication take back events, and community resilience building. We are here to support you.

As a follow-up to our discussion, we propose the following Letter Agreement.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

HMA will provide the following services and any other tasks, as requested:

Support a Community Response Team

Work with FDBH to convene a cross sector CRT

- Identify key partners to participate (i.e., public health, law enforcement, first responders, harm reduction center)
- Identify purpose of CRT
- Develop overarching plan of action
- Develop communication agreements for CRT
- Support facilitation to develop common goals, set of mutually reinforcing activities, communications plan (for external community education/communication) and shared measurement
- Facilitate and develop sustainability plan
- Provide subject matter expertise consultation to identified activities

Provide Communications Support

Work with FDBH to develop a coordinated, cross sector communications plan that reflects best practices in public messaging on SUD, OUD, and harm reduction

- Review communications to ensure alignment with best practices in public messaging on SUD,
 OUD, and harm reduction
- Provide pre-created and tested communication materials to FDBH on harm reduction, OUD, SUD

Provide Tabletop Exercises for Overdose Response

Create six training scenarios and modules to be used in community tabletop exercises that prepare community partners for a coordinated response, debrief, and application of lessons learned to overdose events in Fresno County

- Prepare scenarios and training materials
- Facilitate one half-day tabletop exercise for CRT
- Facilitate one half-day tabletop exercises for CRT agency staff members

STAFFING

Shannon Breitzman will serve as the project manager and will ensure timely completion of deliverables, coordinate team activities, and provide consistent communication with Fresno County Department of Behavioral Health. Additional HMA staff will provide services for the project as subject matter experts as appropriate.

SCHEDULE & TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement will begin on July 1, 2021 and shall continue in effect until December 31, 2021, unless terminated earlier by either party giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice of termination. If this Agreement is terminated by a party's written notice of termination, you agree to compensate HMA for all services rendered prior to HMA's actual knowledge of termination and for all out-of-pocket expenses incurred to date. The staffing arrangements and the scope of work stated in this letter apply to this project only.

PROJECT FEES

The services described above will be provided on a time-and-materials basis. Based on the currently available information, we estimate professional fees and travel time of \$50,000, including expenses. At this time, no expenses or travel time are anticipated for the services described above. As the project progresses, additional requests are made, or the scope evolves, we will provide updated estimates on the overall professional fees and expenses if necessary. We will submit invoices monthly for services provided in the previous month. These invoices will be payable upon receipt.

You agree that, for a period of two (2) years from the date of termination of this Agreement, neither you nor any of your representatives will entice away, solicit for employment, or employ any current or former employee of HMA without the express written consent of HMA. With prior notice, HMA may change the staff assigned to provide the Consulting Services with staff of equal abilities and qualifications. HMA may enter into subcontractor agreements for the performance of the services.

Attached are our standard terms and conditions for the provision of services ("Terms and Conditions"), which are incorporated into this Letter Agreement. This Letter Agreement and the Terms and Conditions will constitute the entire agreement between HMA and Fresno County Department of Behavioral Healthrelated to the project described above.
